

## Haven Franklin Jones, former KHS teacher, dies

Haven Franklin Jones, 71, 904 W. Sycamore St., a former teacher for 40 years at Kokomo High School, died in Howard Community Hospital at 11:30 a.m. Wednesday, Nov. 28, 1979.

He taught in both the science and social studies departments from 1929 to 1948, and until his retirement in 1969 he taught exclusively in the science department.

He was born in Valparaiso April 20, 1908, the son of Alvin H. and Nellie (Franklin) Jones. He was married Aug. 7, 1932, to Jane Wilson, who survives.

Also surviving are a daughter, Jacqueline Jones of Wethersfield, Conn.; a son, Dr. Haven Jones of Indianapolis, and two grandchildren.

He attended elementary school in Gary and was graduated in 1925 from Emerson High School in Gary. He attended Beloit College in Beloit, Wis., from 1925 through 1929 and was graduated with a bachelor's degree.

He also attended Butler University in Indianapolis during the summer of 1929 and attended Valparaiso University during the summer of 1931. He received a master's degree from Chicago University in 1938. He also attended Pratt Institute in Brooklyn, N.Y., in 1960.

He was a member of the Ponderosa Coffee Club and the Haynes Antique Auto Club.

Services will be at 10 a.m. Saturday at Fenn Funeral Home with the Rev. Dr. Daniel C. Kechel officiating. Burial will be in Albright Cemetery.
