

Guy S. Maple, Former County Official, Dies

GREENTOWN—Guy S. Maple, 74, 303 N. Maple St., Greentown, who was a Howard County commissioner from 1930 until 1933, died at 7 a.m. Tuesday at his residence following two weeks' illness.

Born Jan. 1, 1890, in Howard County, he was the son of Frank and Ora (Harper) Maple.

On Sept. 7, 1911, in Taylor Township he was married to Rhea Shenk, who survives. He had resided in Taylor Township until 1953, when he moved to Greentown.

A member of the Meridian Street Christian Church, was serving the church as treasurer, and had been a church elder and chairman of the church board.

He was a past master of Naphtali Lodge No. 389 F and AM, and was a member of the Scottish Rite.

A 1909 graduate of Kokomo High School, he attended Marion College and was a retired farmer.

Surviving with the widow are one daughter, Mrs. Charles (Betty) Lamb, Greentown; a son, George Maple, Tucson, Ariz.; four grandchildren, Ray and Ned Lamb, Greentown, and Kent and Carol Maple, Tucson, Ariz.; five great-grandchildren; and three brothers, Clifford, Kokomo R.R. 6; Dorey, Kokomo R.R. 4; and Audley, Sharpville.

Funeral services will be at 2 p.m. Thursday at Mast and Pickett Funeral Home with the Rev. Howard Jenkins officiating. Burial will be in Albright Cemetery.
