

Mrs. Lawrence Smith

Mrs. Mary Jane Broadley Keeler Smith, 84, 1923 S. Bell St., died at her home at 7:45 p.m. Tuesday. She had been in ill health for several years, but death was unexpected.

Born in Kentucky, May 9, 1877, she was the daughter of Mr. and Mrs. Churchill Spicer. She had lived in Kokomo for the past 47 years.

In 1894 she married George Broadley. She then married Edward Keller, in 1939 and he died in 1946. Later she married Lawrence Smith in 1949, who survives.

For many years Mrs. Smith was employed as a cook at Blanche's Restaurant. She attended the First Baptist Church and was a member of the Royal Neighbors Society.

Surviving with the husband are four daughters, Mrs. Harry (Mattie) Brown of Kokomo, Mrs. Harvey (Vera) Weeks of Tucoma, Wash., Mrs. Cecil (Pearl) Lagle of Mitchell and Mrs. Wesley (Geneva) Jebbs of Indianapolis; three sons, Carroll Broadley of Roan, Elvis Broadley of Frankfort and Forrest Broadley of Kokomo.

Also surviving are four brothers, Frank Spicer of East St. Louis, Ill., Elbert Spicer of Colorado Springs, Colo., Marshall and Oliver Spicer, both of Kokomo; one stepbrother, Harry Harris, also of Kokomo; 35 grandchildren; and several great-grandchildren.
