Homer K. Bugher, 81, 1240 N. Indiana Ave., Kokomo, died at 6:15 a.m. Thursday, Jan. 24, 2002, in his residence. He was born Nov. 4, 1920, in Kokomo, the son of Roscoe W. and Martha R. (Bolen) Bugher. On March 30, 1946, in Kokomo, he married Rosie (Buttice) Bugher.
