Samuel R. Fowler Jr., 73, a resident of Indiana Veterans Home, West Lafayette, died at 5 p.m.  Wednesday, April 29, 1998, at the facility. Born Nov. 7, 1924, in Elmwood, Ohio, he was the son of the late Samuel and Cleo (Tanner) Fowler Sr. He was the husband of Cynthia Taylor, who died Dec. 26, 1990. They were married Dec. 22, 1948, in Cincinnati.
