

**Veteran Teacher of Science in
Local High School; Man
of Fine Worth.**

T. A. Hanson, age 66, retired school teacher, died at his home, 1303 South Washington street, at 11:55 a. m. Thursday of complications. He had been in ill health ever since suffering a stroke of paralysis in Nov. 1930 at the Purdue-Indiana football game in Lafayette. He had been bedfast for the last ten weeks and had been unable to be out and around since early fall.

Following the stroke, however, Mr. Hanson recovered so as to continue teaching in the Kokomo high school, where he taught general science and chemistry since 1921. He retired as school closed for the summer vacation in 1936.

Survivors are the widow, Mrs. Clarie Cooper Hanson; a son, Thomas C. Hanson, who is a member of the faculty of Purdue university, and a granddaughter, Anna-claire Hanson of Lafayette, and a brother, Arthur, residing near New London.

Thomas Albert Hanson was the son of Thomas E. "Uncle Tommy" and Lydia Williams Hanson. He was born July 23, 1870 on the old home place in western Howard county. He attended the New London grades school and graduated from the New London high school.
