Near New London
Dead at Rochester

Allen L. Hawkins, 63, a native of Howard county, died at 5:20 o'clock Tuesday morning at the hospital in Rochester. He had been in failing health for some time and on Sunday, November 8, suffered a paralytic stroke.

He was the son of John and Anna Newby Hawkins and was born near New London where he grew to manhood. For more than 20 years he was a resident there before moving to a farm near Rochester in recent years.

Mr. Hawkins was a birthright member of the Friends church at New London. There being no church of that denomination near his Fulton county home, he united with the Holliness church there, became a teacher in the Sunday school and gave much time to the church. Animated throughout his life by a spirit of good will, he was ever responsive to the needs of others.

Surviving are a son, Claude, living in Texas; a brother, William Hawkins of Paoli; an aunt, Miss Jennie Small, and a number of nieces and nephews.

Funeral services will be held at 1 o'clock Thursday afternoon at the Stout & Son chapel at Russiaville with his pastor and the Rev. John Walters in charge. Burial will be made in the New London cemetery.
