

2-16-1898 HAWORTH.

Clarkson Haworth, trustee of Monroe township, died at his late residence at an early hour this morning of pneumonia, superinduced by la grippe. The announcement of his death startled and saddened his many friends. His illness was of three weeks' duration, but it was not generally known that his condition was critical enough to indicate a fatal ending. Mr. Haworth came to Howard county in 1852, removing from Clinton county, Ohio. He was forty-six years of age, having resided in this county twenty-eight years, winning for himself a name among the best known and most respected men in Monroe township. He was a man of the highest character and unblemished reputation. Two years ago he was honored with the election to be Trustee for the splendid township of Monroe, a position he held with honor to himself and credit to his intelligent and honorable constituency. He was a most excellent man and leaves behind him a memory worthy of much admiration and emulation.

His funeral service will be conducted by Rev. James Newlin, at Friends church in New London, Friday at 10 a. m.
