Dies at Frankfort

FRANKFORT ⁷⁻⁶⁻² — George Heflin, 72, Greenlawn Road, died Thursday in Clinton County Hospital a short time after suffering a heart attack.

He was born Sept. 8, 1889, in Tipton County, the son of William and Phoebe (Brown) Heflin. In his earlier years, he had been engaged in evangelistic work, and was well-known as a singer. For 29 years he was employed by the Crescent Paper Co., until retirement Jan. 1, this year. Mr. Heflin was pastor of Hillcrest Baptist Church at Indianapolis from 1952 until 1959.
