Alzada G. Henderson, 95, 819 W. Virginia Ave., died at 12:35 p.m. Sunday, March 13, 1994, in Saint Joseph Hospital & Health Center.

She was born Nov. 14, 1898, in Elwood, to Mayo E. and Dora (Davis) Baker. Feb. 25, 1915, she married Lawrence Roy "Doc" Henderson, who died Sept. 7, 1971.
