## MILTON H. JONES.

Milton H., second son of Lewis and Emaline Jones, was born March 15th, 1861, near New London, Ind. In 1877 he moved with his parents to Kansas, where he continued to reside for 35 years. On May 12th, 1880, he was united in marriage to Eliza B. Chubbick. Two daughters, Ethel and Cora, were born to them. This family circle was broken by the death of the wife and mother in February, 1905. Milton Jones was again married November 7th, 1906, to Sarah Alabough, of Bangor, Iowa. For six years they made their home in Kansas, then returned to New London to spend his remaining years amid the scenes of his boyhood.

On the morning of December 7th, 1927, at the age of 66 years, 8 months and 22 days, he answered the call which comes to all, and suddenly for him time was changed for eternity. For 3½ years he had been in ill health of dropsy and heart trouble, often coming very near to the crossing so that the summons was not unexpected to him, he having spoken often of the happy release for which he was ready.

Milton Jones was a birthright member of the Friends church, but this fact did not meet his soul's need. When 27 years of age, under the preaching of Dr. Ellis at Oak Creek, Kansas, he sought the Savior and was happily converted. About five years ago, feeling the need of a deeper work of grace in his heart he consecrated himself wholly to the Lord and had since that time enjoyed the abiding presence and comfort of the Holy Spirit. He was faithful in the attendance of the Bible School and other services of the church and maintained a keen interest in all its activities. Until the day of his death he carried on his heart the burden for some of his friends who are still unsaved. God grant the answer to his prayers for them.

There remains to cherish his memory, the wife Sarah Jones, the two daughters, Ethel Silsby, and Cora Wilkins, both of Burr Oak, Kansas; ten grandchildren and two great-grandchildren.

Also four brothers, Calvin and Alfred L., of Wichita, Kansas, Elwood, of North Branch, Kansas, Charles, of Woodland Park, Colo., and three sisters, Sarah Allen and Myrtle Daily, of North Branch, Kansas, and Clara Cline, of Passadena, Cal., also many friends.
