**MEARL GLENDON LIGHTFOOT**

Mearl Glendon Lightfoot, 64, died at 10 p. m., Friday, at his home in Center. He had been in ill health for the past 12 years, his illness becoming critical two weeks ago.

He was born in Grant County, August 30, 1890, the son of Levi and Iva Maple Lightfoot. When he was 16 years old he came to a farm east of Kokomo and lived in Howard County for the remainder of his life, engaged in farming. He was a member of the Hemlock Friends Church.

On June 2, 1917, he married Miss Eunice Watson, who survives with one son and four daughters: Glen Lightfoot of Tipton, Mrs. Josephine White of Windfall, Mrs. Shirley Salmons of Columbus, Mrs. Robert Hunt of Hemlock and Mrs. Carol Bowen of Kokomo. One daughter, Eleanor, died in infancy.

Other survivors are three sisters: Miss Gladys Lightfoot, Mrs. Dessa Osborne and Mrs. Mildred Godwin, all of Kokomo; four brothers: Cleon Lightfoot of Tipton and Waldo, Doyle and Milo Lightfoot of Kokomo; 15 grandchildren and several nieces and nephews.

Funeral services will be at 10 a. m., Monday, at the Hemlock Friends Church, with the Rev. Clarence Ozier officiating. Burial will be in the New London Cemetery. Friends may call at the Fenn Funeral Home after 6 p. m., Saturday.
