

HOWARD W. LONG

Russiaville, May 7—(Tribune Area Special)—Howard W. Long, 66, died about 5 o'clock Friday morning at his home in Russiaville. His physical condition had been impaired for some years and during the last few days became critical, yet the end came suddenly.

Mr. Long had owned and operated a farm in Harrison township about 23 years before moving to Russiaville, where he had purchased a home during the war, looking forward to retirement. He had served in past years as county councilman and as township assessor.

He leaves the widow, a daughter, Mrs. John Nash living on the Long farm near West Middleton; a sister, Mrs. Coach Porter of Kokomo and the following brothers: Lincoln, Thomas and Harley Long of Kokomo, Edward of West Middleton, Henry of Richmond and Dr. John M. Long of Philadelphia, Pa.

He was a member of the Methodist church, transferring his membership from the West Middleton church to Russiaville when he moved to that place. He was deeply interested in his church and supported it with his presence, his material assistance and his prayers.

Funeral services will be held in the Russiaville Methodist church at 2 o'clock (cdt) Sunday afternoon. The pastor, the Rev. Dawson Liggett, will be in charge. Interment will be in the New London cemetery.
