

HENRY NEWLIN DIES OF HEART DISEASE

NEW LONDON, Dec. 14.—Henry Newlin, youngest son of Enoch and Amy Newlin, died at 5:15 o'clock Saturday morning after a week's illness with influenza and heart disease.

Mr. Newlin was fifty-nine years old, and twice had been married. His first wife was Miss Myrtle Schovley who died several years ago. His second marriage was to Miss Pearl Merrell who survives him. There are two daughters living, Mrs. Gladys Fok of Kokomo and Mrs. Dollie Kite of New London. Two grandchildren and two sisters, Mrs. Alice Baker of Russelville and Mrs. Etta Weatherford of Marshall, Ind., also survive.

Mr. Newlin was a lifelong member of the Friends church and a prosperous farmer. He had spent the major part of his life near New London. He was graduated from high school there in 1893. He was a member of the petit jury drawn for this term of circuit court.
