

THOMAS NEWLIN

Thomas Newlin, one of the oldest pioneers of the county, died at the residence of Benjamin Tucker, Monroe township, on April 30th, at 8 o'clock a. m., aged 84 years, 2 months, 7 days. The deceased was born in North Carolina, but removed to Orange county, Indiana, when 34 years of age, and removed to this county 37 years ago. He was the father of 13 children, 6 of whom survive him. He was the progenitor of a large and highly respected family, honored for their culture, piety, and good citizenship. He was a devoted and exemplary member of the Friends Church and was looked upon as one of the pillars in this county. His life was one of remarkable good health, never using glasses to read the finest print. His memory will ever be cherished. A Christian hero has gone to his reward, a good citizen has been lost to time, a sweet memory has been bequeathed to those who mourn.
