

HORACE NEWLIN DIES

WIDELY KNOWN YOUNG MAN
OF NEW LONDON SUC-
CUMBS TUESDAY.

Horace J. Newlin, lifelong resident of New London, died at 2 o'clock Tuesday morning at the Good Samaritan hospital, this city where he had been under treatment for gastric ulcers. He had been ill only a week.

Surviving are the widow, Mrs. Garnet Creed Newlin, to whom he was married seven years ago and a daughter, Carolyn, age five, his parents, Dr. and Mrs. V. H. Newlin of New London, two sisters, Miss Lolo Newlin, a teacher at Whiting and Mrs. Eva Ehrman, west of Kokomo and two brothers, Roy C. of Indianapolis and Eugene M. of New London.

Mr. Newlin was born at New London in August 1896, graduated from the high school there and later took advanced work in Indianapolis, studying dramatic art under Arthur Beriault. He entered service in the World war. On being discharged he and his brother Eugene established the Newlin Bros. garage at New London and have been engaged in business together for fifteen years.

He was reared in the faith of the Friends church and was a member of the Masonic order in New London and of the Order of Eastern Star. He was a young man widely known and held in high regard throughout his circle of friends and acquaintances.

Funeral services will be held at the New London Friends church Thursday morning at 10 o'clock. Burial will be in the nearby cemetery.
