

Howard Padgett

PORT CHARLOTTE, Fla. — Howard "Jake" Padgett, 90, formerly of Russiaville, Ind., died at 11:07 a.m. Tuesday, Aug. 21, 1984, in Fawcett Memorial Hospital here.

Born in Orange County, Ind., Feb. 23, 1894, he was a son of George W. and Isabelle (Stultz) Padgett. June 2, 1920, he married Mary Catherine Carter, who died Dec. 23, 1963. Sept. 16, 1969, he married Thelma Lounsbury Tschetter, who survives.

Padgett was an Army sergeant during World War I. He was owner of Padgett Hardware and Implement Store in Russiaville for 30 years.

He was a charter member and director of Russiaville State Bank, now known as Central National Bank. Other memberships included Port Charlotte United Methodist Church, Port Charlotte Kiwanis Club, Order of Eastern Star 130, Russiaville Masonic Lodge 82 and American Legion Post 412. He is a former member of Russiaville United Methodist Church.

Also surviving are a daughter, Mrs. Eugene (Dorothy) Ingles of Morris, Ill.; three stepsons, Calvin Tschetter of Eagle Grove, Iowa, Ronald Tschetter of Rockford, Ill., and Glen Tschetter of Des Moines, Iowa; a sister, Mrs. Carl (Susie) Norman of Sheridan, Ind.; and four grandchildren. A son, a brother and four sisters are deceased.

Services will be at 11 a.m. Saturday, in Stout and Son Funeral Home, Russiaville. Burial will be in New London (Ind.) Cemetery. Friends may call from 5 to 9 p.m. Friday at the mortuary. Memorials may be made to Russiaville United Methodist Church.
