Former Teacher In Local Schools Dies

Miss Adaline Peacock, for many years a teacher in the Kokomo schools, died at 5:30 o'clock Saturday evening in St. Josephs hospital, where she was taken Thursday. Although her health had been failing for some time, her condition suddenly took a turn for the worse.

Miss Peacock was the daughter of Joseph and Caroline (Jones) Peacock, long time residents of New London neighborhood, and was born one mile east of New London. She was a birthright member of the Friends church.

She was graduated from New London high school and from Indiana State Normal school at Terre Haute. She began teaching in District No. 6, Monroe township, then came to the Kokomo schools. She served as principal of the Meridian school and until her retirement three years ago had been principal of Lincoln school for several years. She was interested in all school activities and was devoted to her home and members of her family.

Surviving are two sisters, Ruth E. and Lydia Peacock, both of Kokomo, and one brother; William J. Peacock of St. Louis.

Funeral services will be held at the home at 10 o'clock Tuesday morning, with the Rev. Murray Johnson of the Union Street Friends church in charge. Burial will be in New London cemetery. The body will be removed from the Rich funeral home to the late home, where friends may call after 6 o'clock Monday evening.
