

MRS. RADCLIFF DIES

LIFE LONG RESIDENT OF THE
COUNTY EXPIRES AT HER
DAUGHTER'S HOME.

Mrs. Lear Runk Radcliff, age 71 years, a life long resident of Howard county, died at 2:10 o'clock Thursday morning at the home of her daughter, Mrs. O. C. Willets, living just east of the city on the water works road. She had been ill for nine weeks, being brought from her home at Russiaville to that of her daughter to be cured. Meeting sickness with the courage and patience that had characterized her entire life, she passed away peacefully.

Mrs. Radcliff was born September 21, 1867, the daughter of Daniel and Caroline Heaton, pioneer residents of the western part of the county. In young womanhood she was married to J. L. Runk who died in 1921. Later she was married to William Radcliff, who also preceded her in death.

Six children were born to Mr. and Mrs. Runk, two dying in infancy. Surviving are the daughter at whose home she died, John L. Runk of Winamac, and Mrs. Inez Wyrick of Frankfort. A son, Ross V. Runk, died last October.

Surviving with the children are two brothers, Lawrence Heaton of Kokomo and Omar Heaton of West Middleton, one sister, Mrs. Lou George of Russiaville, seven grandchildren and one great-grandchild, with a host of relatives and friends.

Mrs. Radcliff was a member of the Reserve Friends church.

The body will be removed to her home in Russiaville where friends may call after Friday morning. Funeral arrangements have not been completed.
