

Howard Woman Dies Of Crash Injuries

Mrs. Mary L. (Mayme) Stout, 74, wife of John Morris Stout, Kokomo route 1, died Saturday morning in the hospital at Huntington, Ind., of injuries received when the car in which she was riding with her husband was in a collision with another car at the intersection of state road 9 and U. S. highway 24, near Huntington.

Mrs. Stout died soon after reaching the hospital. Mr. Stout was bruised and shaken up but was dismissed from the hospital and returned to his home near New London. The other car was driven by Verne Ward, 24, Fort Wayne. He and two passengers were injured, none severely.

Mrs. Stout was born May 31, 1877, at Milroy, Ind., the daughter of Joseph Samuel and Lucinda Rees Somerville. The family moved to a farm north of West Middleton where the daughter grew to womanhood, attending the local school and later Central Normal school and Butler university. She became a school teacher, teaching several years at Greentown prior to her marriage.

September 7, 1905, she and Mr. Stout were married and established their home on the Stout farm.

Surviving with the husband are three children, Mrs. Howard Greenlee, also of Kokomo route 1, Morris Stout of this city and John Stout, Flint, Mich. Mr. and Mrs. Stout were enroute to the home of the last named at the time of the accident.

She leaves also three grandchildren and two brothers, Roy Somerville of Cynthiana, Ky., and Will Somerville of Houston, Tex.

Mrs. Stout was a member of the New London Friends church and of the G. O. A. S. circle of the New London community.

Funeral services will be held at 11 o'clock Tuesday morning at the New London Friends church. Interment will be in the New London cemetery. The casket will not be opened at the church. The body will be taken to the family home Monday morning and friends may call there.
