GEORGE C. TAYLOR

George C. Taylor, 85, a former Howard county commissioner from the First district, died at 6 o'clock Tuesday night at the St. Joseph hospital where he had been a patient the last eight days. Death resulted from complications after an illness of about a year. His home was at 222 South McCann street.

Mr. Taylor was born near New London January 21, 1865, the son of Enoch and Amanda Endicott Taylor. He lived practically his entire life in the same community, farming until he retired a few years ago and moved into Kokomo.

He was elected a county commissioner in 1928, serving four years.

He was married December 2, 1837 to Miss Minnie Belle Bates, who died May 17 of this year.

Surviving are two children, Miss Bertha Taylor at home and Dennis P. Taylor of this city. Two children are dead, one dying in infancy, a daughter, Fern, at the age of 19 years. He leaves a granddaughter, Judith Ann Taylor, and several nieces and nephews.

Funeral services will be held at 2 o'clock Friday afternoon at the Fenn funeral home with the Rev. Thurman Morris officiating. Burial will be in the New London cemetery. Friends may call at the funeral home after 2 o'clock Thursday afternoon.
