

Death of Ellen Turner.

Ora Ellen, daughter of William and Margaret Moulder, was born at Paoli, Orange county, Indiana, August 27, 1866, and after a painful illness of four weeks with typhoid fever, terminating in acute pleurisy, all of which she bore with much patience and resignation, she fell asleep in Jesus at her home, one-half mile north of Russiaville, at 11 o'clock a. m., December 4, 1899, aged thirty-three years, three months and seven days. From 1873 to 1880 she resided with her parents in this city, where she still has many school-girl friends. She was converted early in life, and united with the Friends church at the age of fifteen years, and lived a consistent christian life until the day of her death. On October 16, 1892, she was united in marriage with Samuel E. Turner, son of Rev. Jesse T. Turner, and to them were born two sons, both of whom died in infancy. The funeral services, which occurred at New London Friends church at 10 o'clock Wednesday, conducted by Rev. Sylvester Newlin of this city and Rev. Nathan Knight of Russiaville, was largely attended and was both appropriate and impressive. Interment in New London cemetery. A husband, father, mother, three sisters, two brothers, and a large circle of sympathizing friends are left to mourn her seemingly untimely departure to the bright, heavenly clime.
