

Earl J. Vogus ^{Feb. 3}

Dies at Russiaville

RUSSEVILLE, (Tribune Area Special)—Earl J. Vogus, 76, died at his home in Russiaville at 6:40 p.m. Friday. He had been bedfast since last August and had suffered several paralytic strokes.

Mr. Vogus was born Dec. 23, 1889, in Honey Creek Township, the son of William P. and Nancy (Creason) Vogus. On May 5, 1903, he was married to Lessie Fritz, who survives. Their married life was spent on their farm three miles east of Russiaville until four years ago when they moved to Russiaville.

Mr. Vogus attended the Lynn School east of Russiaville and was a member of the Lynn Friends Church. He served as trustee of the church for several years. He transferred his membership to the Russiaville Friends Church where he also served as trustee and was an active member until his health failed him.

Other survivors include a daughter, Mrs. Lee (Edith) Dixon of Kokomo, and a son Russell Vogus of Russiaville R. R. 1. One son, Dayton, preceded him in death September 1936.

Others surviving include six grandchildren, two great-grandchildren, a sister, Mrs. Ora Butler of Russiaville and a foster brother, Guy R. Miller, of Chicago.

Funeral services will be at the Russiaville Friends Church Sunday at 2 p.m. Burial will be in New London Cemetery. Friends may call at the Stout and Son Funeral Home in Russiaville after 7 p.m. Saturday.
