Robert C. Wilson, 62, a widely-known horseman, died in the St. Joseph Memorial Hospital at 2:30 a.m. Wednesday following an extended illness.

His home was on Russiaville R. R. 1 where he had raised registered quarter-horses. *6-25-1968*

Born in Beattyville, Ky., April 27, 1907, he was the son of Arch and Nannie (Cole) Wilson. He had lived in this vicinity for the past 20 years. A 19-year employe of the Chrysler Corp., he had worked in Department 86.

Surviving with the widow, the former Beulah Goodman, to whom he was married in 1963, are two sons, Ralph D. Wilson, Kokomo, and Ernest Wilson, Dayton, Ohio; two daughters, Mrs. Stan (Wilma) Kanabel and Mrs. Raymond (Fern) Mamner, both of Dayton, Ohio, and 16 grandchildren.

He was a member of the Calvary Temple Church here and had served on the church's board of trustees. He was also a member of the United Autoworkers Local Union 685.
