

Charles Zell of Bunker Hill Dies Tuesday Night

Bunker Hill, Jan. 25.—(Tribune Special)—Charles Zell, age 68, former Howard county man who was well known in this community, died at 6:30 o'clock Tuesday night in a Logansport hospital where he had been a patient.

Son of Jacob and Mildred Amos Zell, he was born March 16, 1872, near West Middleton. On December 2, 1900, he married Miss Milley Johnson of West Middleton and to the union were born four children who survive with the widow. They are Walter and John of West Middleton, Edna at the home near Bunker Hill, and Fred of Indianapolis.

He is also survived by four brothers, Amos and Thomas, both of West Middleton, Omer of Parker and Emmett of Waukegan, Ill.; one sister, Mrs. Thomas Relsh of West Middleton, and eight grandchildren.

The body was removed to the Glazier mortuary in Bunker Hill and will be returned to the late residence Wednesday night. Friends may call at the home, the family said. He was a prominent member of the Bunker Hill Methodist church where funeral services will be held at 1:30 o'clock Friday afternoon with the Rev. A. D. Burkett of Wabash officiating. The Rev. Mr. Burkett is a former pastor of the Bunker Hill church. Burial will be made in the New London cemetery.
