Just a few minutes before she died she asked her nurse for a pencil and paper. She wrote the name of Rev. John L. Puckett, then looking up to her nurse she asked to see her father. She was on his way to her. She said: "Tell father I will not be able to see him but I am going home; mother is calling me." She then closed her eyes on this sad world that has meant so much suffering and sorrow for her to wake up in that better land where tears and sorrow are never known.
