

# PLENNIE DUPLER'S FUNERAL FRIDAY

## Young Man a Victim of Tuberculosis of Spine

Pleunie Dupler, aged twenty-five, son of Mr. and Mrs. H. C. Dupler, died at the home of his parents, 120 S. 6th street, Wednesday night of tuberculosis of the spine superinduced by an injury which he received in an accident at Kokomo many months ago. The funeral will be held at the residence of the parents at 10 o'clock Friday morning. Rev. John T. Collier, pastor of the S. 9th street M. M. church, will have charge of the services and the interment will occur at West Union, ten miles west of Kokomo.

The young man has been confined to his room since last Thanksgiving. About a year ago, while employed at Kokomo, an automobile, coming up from behind him struck him on the hip, inflicting an injury from which he never recovered.

At the time of the accident he was not in good health. His parents have been residents of Noblesville about three years. He is survived by his father and mother, one brother, Darrell, a student in the local high school and one sister, Delilah.
