

# LON FRENCH DIES SUDDENLY AT HOME OF DAUGHTER HERE

Friends of Alonzo French were shocked Wednesday morning to hear of his sudden death at the home of his daughter, Mrs. Eunice Smith, 712 North Locke street, which occurred about 9 o'clock. Although he had been suffering from a heart affliction for five years past he did his usual work at the filling station at Markland and Park avenues Tuesday.

The deceased was born to Ralph and Eliza Ann French on April 11, 1868 in Ervin township. In 1906 he went to Oklahoma, where he lived for a period of four years, but returned to Howard county and has resided in this community since that time.

He was united in marriage in 1890 to Miss Lucretia Need, who died about three years ago. Mr. French was active in civic affairs and served two terms as trustee of Ervin township and was for a time truuant officer of Center township. He was for many years employed at the Workman & Son grocery. He was a member of the Union Street Friends church.

The survivors include six children: Myron; Mrs. Eunice A. Smith and Mrs. Elsie O. Turner, of Kokomo; Charles, of Peru; Everett T., of Ervin township, and Mrs. Edna A. DeLon, west of Kokomo.

The funeral will be held at the Union Street Friends church at 2 o'clock Friday afternoon, with the pastor, the Rev. A. Ward Applegate, officiating, assisted by the Rev. Thomas Newlin. Burial will be at the North Union cemetery in Ervin township. Friends may call after 10 o'clock Thursday morning.
