DEATH OF MRS. GARBERT
Sublime *5-12-1903*

Who Was Injured in An Auto Runaway
in Kokomo Several Months Ago.

Mrs. William Garbert died this morning at her late home near Kappa, in Ervin township, aged about seventy years. The death of Mrs. Garbert is said to have resulted from an injury received late last fall out on Philips street in a runaway. Mr. and Mrs. Garbert had come to town to do some trading and while driving along Philips street their horse became frightened at an automobile that was being operated by Sam Myers and Jesse Haines, the first machine of the kind that was turned out by the Standard Manufacturing company. The horse ran away, overturning the buggy and throwing the aged couple out. Mrs. Garbert was very badly used up. One arm and two or three ribs were broken and other severe bruises were received. She was taken to the office of Dr. J. W. Wright, who dressed her injuries. Since that time Mrs. Garbert has not seen a well day and her friends attribute her death to internal injuries received in the above described accident. The funeral arrangements have not been announced.
