

MRS. GARBERT DIES TUESDAY 1938 AT HOSPITAL

Wife of Prominent Farmer in
Howard County Succumbs;
Funeral Thursday.

Death came to Mrs. Louise M. Garbert, wife of Fred C. Garbert, at 9:25 o'clock Tuesday morning. She died at the Good Samaritan hospital of complications after an illness of five weeks.

She was removed to the hospital from her home, nine miles northwest of Kokomo, two weeks ago. She was 71 years old.

Other survivors, besides her husband, are two sons, Louis Garbert, Route 1, Galveston, and Elmer Garbert, Lawrenceville, Ill.; three daughters, Mrs. Linna Bostic, rural route, Kokomo, Mrs. Lela Anderson, Philadelphia, Pa., and Miss Emmeline Garbert, at home; one half-sister, Mrs. Emma Maroz, Indianapolis, and five grandchildren.

One daughter, Lorena, died in infancy, and one son, Fred H. Garbert, preceded his mother in death two and one-half years ago.

Born in New York, N. Y., Mrs. Garbert came to Indianapolis with her parents when she was very young. She moved to Howard county when she was 10 years old and had resided here continuously since.

She had been a member of the Redeemer Lutheran church for many years.

The body was removed to the Eilers mortuary and will be returned to the late residence Wednesday. Friends may call after 2 o'clock in the afternoon.

Funeral services will be held at the Redeemer Lutheran church, Union street at Jefferson street, Thursday afternoon at 2 o'clock. The Rev. Carl Ahlbrand, pastor, will officiate. Burial will follow in the North Union cemetery.
