Walter William McCoy, age 54 years of 1236 South Waugh St., Kokomo, passed away suddenly of a heart attack Wednesday night, November 4, 1942 at 10:21 o'clock, while attending a meeting at the American Legion Home. His health had not been good for some time, but was not serious and he had worked Wednesday at his regular employment at the Haines Stellite Company.

He was born in Monroe Twp., Howard county, August 18, 1888 and was one of nine children of Benjamin and Alice McCoy. Nov., 24, 1922 he was married to Lena Ethel Downey and to them were born two children.

Surviving is the wife and son Willard of Kokomo and one daughter Phyllis Jean at home; two brothers, Ross G. McCoy and Lester V. McCoy of Kokomo; four sisters: Mrs. Mary Miller of near Bennetts Switch; Miss Catherine McCoy of Kokomo; Mrs. Mabel Lord and Mrs. Opal Yoder of Indianapolis.

He was a machinist by trade and had worked at the Haines Stellite Company for the past fourteen years.

He attended the South Side Christian church.

Mr. McCoy served in the World War No. 1 seeing service in France, receiving an honorable discharge.

He was a present commander of the Veterans of Foreign Wars and a member of the American Legion, both organizations having charge of military rites.

Walter William McCoy, 54, commander of the local post of Veterans of Foreign Wars and a resident at 1236 South Waugh street, died suddenly at 10:21 o'clock Wednesday night at the American Legion home. He was a member of that veteran organization as well as the V. F. W. and had attended the regular meeting. As he started down the stairs the fatal attack of heart disease seized him.

While his health had not been good for some time, he had worked Wednesday at his regular employment at the Haines Stellite, where he had been a machinist for 14 years. *d 11-4-1942*

Mr. McCoy was born August 8, 1888 in Monroe township, one of nine children of Benjamin and Alice McCoy. He married Miss Lena Ethel Downey on November 24, 1922.

Surviving with the wife are a son, Willard, living at 1133 South Buckeye street and a daughter, Phyllis Jean, at home. He leaves two brothers, Ross G. and Lester V. McCoy, both of Kokomo and four sisters, Mrs. Mary Miller near Bennetts Switch, Miss Catherine McCoy of Kokomo and Mrs. Mabel Lord and Mrs. Opal Yoder, both of Indianapolis.

Mr. McCoy served with the army in France in the first World War and on receiving his honorable discharge returned to make his home here.

He attended the South Side Christian church where the funeral will be held at 10 o'clock Saturday morning with the pastor, Burris Butler, in charge. Military ceremonies will be conducted by the V.F.W. and American Legion. Burial will be in North Union cemetery. The body will be taken from the Wayne Ladd funeral home to the residence late Thursday night. *6 Nov 1942*
