She was united in marriage with Benjamin C. McCoy, Feb. 28, 1882. To this union was born nine children, one of whom preceded her to the grave when but two years old. The eight living children left to mourn her loss are, Ross McCoy, Walter McCoy, Mrs. Mary Miller, Lester McCoy, Catheryn McCoy and Mrs. Opal Gollner all of Kokomo, and Mrs. Mable Lord of Hammond, Ind., and Mrs. Maude Releford of Economy, Ind., all of whom with the husband have the heartfelt sympathy of their many neighbors and friends. She united with Judson church and was baptized when but a girl. Later becoming a member of the Friends church at Bethel, and remained a member until her death.
