

FOUND DEAD IN BED

HENRY POHLMAN OF KAPPA EX-
PIRES OF HEART FAILURE.

Well Known Blacksmith of Near
Kappa, Who Lived Alone With His
Mother, Who Was Over Ninety-two,
Dies at His Home Monday.

Henry Pohlman, aged sixty-five
years, a blacksmith living two miles
west of Kappa, and one of the best
known men in that neighborhood, was
found dead in his bed Monday. Death
resulted, it is believed, from heart
failure. Mr. Pohlman and his mother,
aged ninety-two years, lived together.
Mr. Pohlman was unmarried.

Henry Pohlman was widely known
in the west end of the county. He was
a man of clean and correct life, indus-
trious, sober and honest, and he num-
bered his friends by the hundred. He
had conducted the little smithy by
the roadside for many years.

Coroner Harrison has viewed the
body, and pronounced the man dead
from heart failure. The funeral will
be conducted Wednesday morning at
10 o'clock from the German Lutheran
church. Burial at Kappa.
