

## CHARLES GRAHAM 1947

Russiaville, Ind., April 27—(Tribune Area Special)—Charles Graham, 81, long-time resident of Russiaville, died early Sunday morning at the home of his daughter, Mrs. Joe Habben of Anderson.

Short services will be held at the home in Anderson at 2:30 o'clock Tuesday afternoon. The body will be brought to the Stout & Son funeral home in Russiaville, where funeral services will be conducted at 2:30 o'clock Wednesday afternoon by the Rev. Ralph Graham of Muncie, nephew of the deceased. Burial will follow in Russiaville cemetery.

The Masonic and Odd Fellows lodges will take part in the services, he being a member of those orders at Russiaville. The Rev. Ralph Graham of Muncie, a nephew, will be in charge.

For many years Mr. Graham lived on and operated a farm two miles southwest of Russiaville. He moved to Anderson in 1925 and was employed by the Delco Remy corporation until his retirement several years ago. He was the son of the Rev. Andrew Jackson and Lucinda Graham and was born in Hamilton county but moved to Howard county at an early age. He was reared in the Baptist faith.

He was twice married, first to Ella B. Hodson who died in 1916 and later to Lydia J. Wills who died a few years ago.

Surviving are three daughters, Mrs. Habben at whose home he died, Mrs. Edna Huddleston of Alexandria and Martha L. Graham of Fort Wayne; three sons, Russell K., L. Ralph and Lloyd Graham, all of Anderson; a brother, Milton M. Graham near Bippus; nine grandchildren and five great-grandchildren, with a number of nephews and nieces.
