Charles K. Conwell, 76, 1040 S. Armstrong St., died at 5:48 p.m. Sunday, Feb. 4, 2001, at Saint Joseph Hospital & Health Center in Kokomo. Born Dec. 20, 1924, in Kokomo, he was the son of George and Ada (Lyons) Conwell. On April 2, 1944, in Kokomo, he married Martha B. Goudy, who died Sept. 29, 1999.

He was a 1943 graduate of Kokomo High School. He was an Army veteran of World War II, serving as a surgical technician, seeing action in the Rhineland and central Europe. He retired Nov. 15, 1966, after 25 years of service, with the rank of Major, from the Kokomo Police Department. He later was in charge of security at Continental Steel Corporation. He had been employed in part time positions with Eriks

Chevrolet, Herbst Apothecary, Hobson Cleaners and Fenn & Shirley Mortuary.

He was a member of the First Church of the Nazarene, where he had served on several boards and had sung in the choir. He was a life member of the Elks Lodge, where he was serving as chaplain and had been a trustee and had served as chairman of the National Foundation Committee. He was a member of the Fraternal Order of Police, where he held several offices; Kokomo Moose Lodge and the Kokomo Senior Citizens Center.

Surviving are a son, Stan Conwell, Indianapolis; a daughter, Carole Henson, Sharpville; four grandchildren, Luke Henson, Sharpville; Jeremy Conwell and wife Melissa of Indianapolis; Christopher Conwell and Joseph Conwell; a great-grandson, Devon Conwell, Indianapolis; a sister, Iola, Indianapolis and several nieces and nephews. He was preceded in death by his parents, wife and a brother, George William Conwell.
